Students will examine the roots of some of the most prominent social, cultural, political, and gendered norms often attributed to the Arab World. Diverse materials will enhance students' global competencies and enable them to reflect upon the varied life experiences of people from North Africa.

Students will critically examine Moroccan films to understand social, political and economic realities of Morocco and other cities. Students will learn about the role of Moroccan filmmakers in social and political change and stay with Moroccan families to further develop their global competence and understanding of Moroccan cultures, practices, and gender dynamics.
